

LASSITER NAMED NEW COBWRA PRESIDENT

The Coalition of Boynton West Residential Associations will install Ken Lassiter as its new president at its April 15 meeting at the Quail Ridge community clubhouse on Golf Road. Active in **COBWRA** since 1997, Lassiter served as first vice president for two years and previously as second vice president and secretary for three years each. Lassiter was elected at the March 18 **COBWRA** meeting, succeeding Barbara Katz, president for the past three years. The April 15 meeting begins at 9:30 a.m. and is open to everyone.

Lassiter, 74, is a native of Richmond, Va., and graduated from Virginia Tech with an engineering degree. He worked at Eastman Kodak Company in Rochester, N.Y., for 36 years as an engineer, technical editor and director of Kodak Publications. He also was director of photo trade relations and manager of photography education for the Photographic Group. Lassiter was executive producer of the award-winning videoconference series "Techniques of the Masters" also broadcast on The Learning Channel from 1989 until 1994. Lassiter retired from Kodak in 1993 and retired to South Florida. Starting in 1994, he served until 2007 as executive director of the Photo Imaging Education Association, an organization of photography teachers from 19 countries.

Lassiter is a resident of Pipers Glen Estates in the Westchester County Club area. He served for 10 years on the HOA board of directors and as president for four years.

Other new officers to be installed are Stuart Caine, of Ponte Vecchio West, as first vice president; Eric Malkin, of Boynton Waters, as second vice president; Ellen Gabler, of Coral Lakes, as secretary; and Bruce Gumpel, of Ponte Vecchio, as treasurer. Palm Beach County Commissioner Burt Aaronson is expected to swear in the new **COBWRA** officers.

COBWRA is a nonprofit civic organization of 88 condo and homeowner community members in the West Boynton area from Lantana Road south to the Delray Beach line at the Lake Worth Drainage District L-30 Canal.
